20-43 COVID-19 FINANCIAL RELIEF MEASURES:

MitchellWHEREAS, on March 11, 2020, the World Health Organization declared the spread ofHoenmansCOVID-19 a global pandemic, which will have a devastating impact on the local economy;

BE IT RESOLVED THAT, effective immediately the City of Melfort agrees to implement measures to provide temporary financial relief to our customers in the following manner:

- 1. All utility disconnections will be suspended until September 30, 2020;
- Late payment charges will be suspended on all utility accounts until September 30, 2020;
- 3. NSF charges on payments for property tax and utilities will be suspended until September 30, 2020;

- 4. The Tax Penalty Bylaw will be amended to provide property owners an additional three months (to September 30, 2020) to pay without incurring penalties on their 2020 current taxes;
- 5. The Tax Penalty Bylaw will be amended to suspend penalties on tax arrears from April 1, 2020, to September 30, 2020;
- 6. The tax enforcement process will be delayed for a three-month period to June 30, 2020, for the application of tax liens and the six month notice of arrears. **Carried**
